The Town House is, by design, often a difficult structure for disabled visitors; having many staircases, no elevators and generally having been constructed in an age before accessibility was to the fore. Moreover, the Listed status of the building now restricts those improvements we can implement to improve access. However, we do offer large-print information for visitors attending our guided tours and 'open house' events and other forms of specialized information and we would always encourage disabled visitors to contact us so that we can discuss individual access requirements and solutions.

Furthermore, we believe our website should provide an essential aid to access, enabling visitors to view information relating to The Regency Town House interests. We work hard to ensure our website is compliant with Web Accessibility Initiative (W.A.I) guidelines, thereby providing a high degree of usability for people with disabilities, allowing greater understanding, navigation and interaction.
